Secretary of State met 4 Party leader's this morning and then held photo call.

First plenary meeting agreed business arrangements followed by brief statement from John Alderdice, brief(ish) statement by Hume, depressing paper from J Cunningham and rant about security and Anglo Irish Agreement from Paisley.

Mayhew took strong lead which may be beneficial and Hanley appears to be very straightforward but attitude of other parties very depressing: no sign of movement from Unionists, reiteration of Scots/Welsh devolution red herrings by OU's and provocative behaviour of Paisley. Strains are already showing between 2 Unionist parties. When is the appropriate time for papers to be presented by those who are "willing" to do so?

It is important that Business Committee behaviour determines what is agreed and negotiations on further issues are confirmed to Plenary meetings.

It is probably impossible to agree on the nature of the problem: institutions may be established which are viewed differently by different parties.
