Dear John,


Enclosed is the Conference Programme for the weekend. I'm delighted that you will be joining us, and I hope that you find the proceedings interesting.

Dear John,


Many, many thanks for taking so much trouble and travelling so far to come to Galway last Saturday week to address our Conference on Northern Ireland.

Apologies for the delay in writing, which was due to my absence in Washington last week. See you at the Forum.


