I saw you briefly at Bangor so am not as persistent at my tardy reply as I would otherwise be. Ball-point collapsed...

The next phase of the process is going to be tough. S.F. are giving nothing, and David T. is in need of support. In my speech to the North Down selectors I warned them about my view of U.U.P./Orange formal links. They did not, apparently, find that objectionable. I also endorsed the watch of Alliance and how much it will be needed in the crisis to come. A small "it" seems a small price to pay for the survival of the Assembly. This got a good reaction on the doorstep too. Impertinent of me to tell you what you might do....!

I have told my party that it would
make sense to get behind Allaine for
Chairman of the Assembly, as the UUP
need the votes it has got, and "steri-
lising" me through the chairmanship means
one less. Sean Nelson would do the
job well.

You will have an important role
in the Lords keeping interest and support
for N.I. alive; it is in danger of coll-
apse, I fear. I wish I could help in
some way to keep alive some good
will there, which Downesee will disenchant.

which is really just a "thank-you" for
your outstanding bid reaction to the
K.
