OLYMPIA, July 18.—Politics were dragged into and kicked about and then out of the convention today when Warner introduced his measure for minority representation in the judiciary. The scheme proposed was the same that was first heard of in Washington when the enabling act was read, and when it was found that no elector should be allowed to exercise his full right in suffrage in voting for judges, but that he should be entitled to vote for two out of every three. It was this partisan device that gave the Democrats such a large representation in the convention, and it was also this that encouraged them to attempt the introduction of a plan into the organic law by which they could always be able to slip a Democrat onto the supreme bench, whether he received a majority of the popular vote or not.
