NORTHERN IRELAND: BRIEFING LINES

In Cabinet this morning it was decided that an updated line of briefing on Northern Ireland should be circulated today to Cabinet Ministers.

I enclose appropriate notes which have been agreed between No.10 and the Northern Ireland Office. I would be grateful if the recipients of this letter could ensure that the material is distributed to all Ministers in their Departments. The NIO will answer any questions on the briefing or requests for additional information.

In addition to the general lines to be taken in public comment, I enclose short extracts from statements made in support of the Joint Declaration. These can be used freely in conjunction with yesterday's exchanges in the House of Commons, as reported in Hansard. The NIO will circulate a fuller list of supportive statements, which they shall then update as appropriate.

The key point on which we wish to focus attention is whether the Provisionals will take this opportunity to give up violence for good and enter the democratic process. Ministers should stress that they will never have a better opportunity. Given the fair treatment which the Joint Declaration assures for those in Northern Ireland who hold nationalist aspirations, the endorsement of the Irish Government, and the support of John Hume and other leading public figures, the Provisionals must realise that they would have no excuse, no justification and no future in continuing their policy of violence. Were they to do so, they would receive no sympathy from all those who see the Joint Declaration as a fair and balanced document.

Copies of this letter go to the Private Secretaries to all Cabinet Ministers and to Juliet Wheldon (Law Officers Department), Murdo Maclean (Chief Whip's Office) and Melanie Leech (Cabinet Office).
