Father Gerry Reynolds, C.Ss.R. Redemptorist Priest. Clonard Monastery, Belfast.

Dr. George Dallas, chest specialist (retired), Ulster Presbyterian. Described in the "Irish Press" (Dublin paper) as "the most radical thinker in the North".

Mrs. Ruth Dallas, Swiss.

Senator Ruairi Brugha, former Irish Senator, former M.E.P. and ^{vice} chairman of the Political Affairs Committee of the European Parliament.

Son of Cathal Brugha, who took part in the "1916 Rising" and later was first president of the Irish Parliament and was killed in the civil war.

Mrs. Maire Brugha, daughter of Terence MacSwiney, Lord Mayor of Cork who was arrested by the British and imprisoned in Wormwood Scrubs where he died after 73 days hunger-strike.

Mrs. Ruth Hume, daughter of Archdeacon Hannon and sister of the Bishop of Clogher (C. of I.). Was chairman of Belfast branch of the Ulster Teachers' Union. At one time Head of Department in a big Dulwich Comprehensive School.

Dr. Roderick Evans, Anglo-Irish landowning family in the Republic. Fellow of the Royal College of Surgeons Dublin, Historian.

Mr. William Porter, Anglo-Irish from Dublin. Son of a University Professor. Graduate of Trinity College Dublin, Classics Scholar. Lived in Italy for some years.

Mrs. Muriel Porter. Anglo-Irish. Graduate of Trinity College Dublin.

Mr. James Lynn. Catholic from West Belfast. Helped Fr. McCarthy initiate the Clonard Catholic/Protestant Bible Study group. Works at Queens University Belfast in laboratories as an instrument maker. Only Catholic in the department.
