CROSS BORDER SECURITY COOPERATION

A: BACKGROUND NOTE

Importance of the Border to the Provisional IRA

- 1. At the February 1992 Summit, Mr Reynolds questioned the extent of PIRA's use of the Republic: "the border is not the problem". Yet the Republic is used by terrorists for training, engineering, storage of arms and ammunition, and as the base for attacks into NI. Five of the eight PIRA Mk 15 mortar attacks in the last 6 months have used vehicles stolen in the Republic. A list of recent incidents mounted from the Republic is attached.
- 2. Garda successes attached also demonstrate PIRA's exploitation of the Border. The RUC and Garda agree that the bulk Of the 1980s Libyan shipments is still in deep hides in the Republic.
- 3. The Irish sometimes claim that, although the Border <u>is</u> exploited by terrorists, they devote adequate resources to countering this, having <u>doubled</u> the number of Garda in Border Divisions since 1970. Points to make are that:
- over the same period <u>RUC</u> manpower in Border areas has <u>tripled</u> (from 900 to 3000+) and army deployments have massively increased;
- there were <u>25</u> deaths as a result of the security situation in 1970, compared with <u>85</u> in 1992. So, despite the extra resources, the <u>threat</u> has grown further. <u>More still needs to be done</u>.

Chilcot/Dalton Group

4. It was agreed following the Summit with Mr Haughey in December 1991 that a high-level official working group would establish a work programme on cross-border security issues, reporting back any disagreement to the Heads of Government for further discussion. This working group also side-reports to the Intergovernmental Conference (the Irish are eager to maintain the IC's status in this exercise). Papers have recently been exchanged on a number of topics (including the RUC's dedicated anti-terrorist organisation, which we hope the Garda might move towards emulating) and the group will meet again shortly.
