## DOORSTEP WITH TAOISEACH

We are discussing Community issues, foreign policy problems including UN peace-keeping operations, and of course the talks process in Northern Ireland. The Taoiseach and I are doing this as old friends and close partners. We shall continue our talks over a working supper.

On Copenhagen, there are no serious differences between us over the points to come before the European Council. We both attach importance to discussion there on growth and employment; on enlargement and the Community's relations with Central and Eastern Europe and Russia; and on subsidiarity.

On Northern Ireland:

we would like the talks process to continue and develop;

- we continue to believe that its objectives are achievable;
  - the next phase will involve further bilateral contacts to try to establish more common ground between the participants;

the British and Irish Governments will work closely on the substance of, in particular, Strand 3.

We have also, of course, discussed security. Security cooperation between Ireland and the UK has been a success story.
