Could you find out who will accompany the Taoiseach, Tanaiste and Minister for Justice? Will the Irish Ambassador attend? For the working supper, we shall need to keep the numbers down to six-a-side if we are to fit in the Small Dining Room here.

You have told me that the Foreign Secretary would attend the talks, but would not be able to stay for the supper. You suggested that Sir David Gillmore should take his place at the supper table (in which case, I assume that he will wish to attend the talks as well). I understand that the Secretary of State
